Chairman's Notes March 2017

We have continued to make progress on the Community Leisure Facility which will be built on the land between Cosby Road and Thomas Estley Community College.

We have had expressions of interest from a number of leisure centre operators and with the help of our consultant reduced that to four credible bidders for the contract to Design, Build, Operator and Maintain (DBOM) the leisure centre.

Shortly we will meet each bidder again to go through their initial proposals so we can see who offers the best solution for our situation. They will then do a detailed bid which we will then contract against. That process will take until August - September when we would be looking to place the contract.

As it stands we have secured funding for the new leisure facilities from the new housing development, plus some from an earlier development which will be used for this project. There is likely to be additional money required to get the right combination of facilities and there are several ways to get additional funding. This could be in the form of grants for sports groups and / or other areas of government funding etc. The exact amount of money we might need to find will only become clear once we have received the detailed offers from the bidders. However, in preparation we have met and formally approached Harborough District Council (HDC) for support.

HDC's response to me at this time is "Harborough District Council will continue to work with Broughton Astley Parish Council where possible to ensure that the wider benefits of the Neighbourhood Plan are delivered." Once we have more details we will inform you.

Based on placing the contract in September 2017 the centre could be open by the last quarter of 2018. As soon as we have more details we will let you know and it will be shared on social media and on our web site (http://www.broughton-astley.gov.uk)

FLY THE FLAG FOR THE COMMONWEALTH

On Monday 13 March 2017 saw the inaugural Fly the Flag for the Commonwealth held at the War Memorial, Frolesworth Road, Broughton Astley. The Parish Council arranged for Councillor William Liquorish to raise the flag at 10am on behalf of Broughton Astley and pupils from Thomas Estley Community College read the Commonwealth Affirmation. This years' theme is 'A peace building Commonwealth' which hopes to raise the awareness of mutual respect, resilience and peace though out the Commonwealth. Also in attendance was the Revd Sharon Constable and members of the Royal British Legion.

DOG FOULING

Dog fouling on footways around the village and on the Recreation Ground has once again become a real problem. We have received numerous complaints from residents who are frustrated that dog owners are not taking responsibility for their dogs. *To allow a dog to foul in a public place and not clear it up is anti-social, irresponsible and illegal.*

It is an offence to:

- Fail to pick up after your dog (ie. dog fouling). This will now include all land to which the public can gain access including agricultural land.
- Failing to provide at the request of an authorised officer the means to pick up after a dog (eg.bags).
- Anyone ignoring the order could be issued with a £100 fixed penalty notice, or be taken to court with a fine on conviction of up to £1,000.

The Parish Council is working with Harborough District Council Enforcement Team to patrol specific area.

Baga Bill says:

April

Plant outdoor containers with spring bedding plants such as violas and re-pot any houseplants that need it. Plant new perennials, shrubs and climbers; now is also the best time for planting or moving evergreens.



In the veg patch, sow lettuce, rocket, carrots, spring onions, radishes, spinach and beetroot.

Treat lawn problems: use a combined feed and treatment product or rake out small patches of moss and remove weeds.

May

Deadhead spring bulbs and by early May it's safe to plant tomatoes in unheated greenhouses.

If you do nothing else this spring:

- Feed the lawn and start mowing more frequently;
- Plant up some cheery tubs and hanging baskets;
- Clip hedges: and
- · Keep on top of regular weeding!

Broughton Astley Gardeners Association (BAGA)

The days are getting longer and those who enjoy gardening are actively preparing their ground for the sowing of seeds and planting out. In previous years we held our annual bedding plant sale in May, unfortunately our plant supplier ceased trading, and we are no longer able to source a sufficient supply of quality flower plants to justify the running of the sale.

We appreciate that many local people previously supported this event, and BAGA rely on any profit being put towards the running of the annual Village Show in August. As an alternative, and in line with last year, Sharnford Garden Centre has agreed to offer a one-off 10% reduction on the sale of all plants made at their recently extended garden centre site, between the dates of 29th May and 2nd June inclusive.

To take advantage, simply take this voucher when making your purchase. Hopefully this offer goes some way towards off-setting the disappointment of the cancellation of our plant sale and BAGA also benefits by receiving a percentage.

Some of our members who grow their own plants will hopefully have sufficient spare plants to enable us to offer a limited supply of vegetable plants as a one-off event to meet the potential demand. We hope to be able to offer various varieties of tomato, pepper, chilli and bean plants, on a first come, first served basis, along with a wide range of gardening supplies at the BAGA Trading Hut on The Western Willows Allotments on Sunday 21st May between 10.00 and 12.00 only.

Wendy Martin visited us to tell us about the trek she had made to fulfil an ambition to see Ugandan lions, one of only two species that climb trees, and mountain gorillas. After a short study tour in north Uganda with the "Send a Cow" charity for which she works, the trek started southwards to the Queen Elizabeth National Park, and her slide presentation showed us the marvellous selection of animals and birds she saw on the way. Her driver and guide eventually tracked down several of the famous tree-climbing lions lazing in fig trees by the roadside. Then it was on to the Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, which borders Rwanda and the DRC, and a difficult and steep climb to find the mountain gorillas. Those living in this part of the rain forest have been "habituated" by guides to be used to visitors for one hour a day. Wendy was enchanted to see a family group with youngsters and a huge silverback male who, after the allotted hour, all simply vanished further into the forest as if they knew that time was up! Our March speaker will be talking about the history of masks and in April we will be hearing about the designer Laura Ashley and her "Designs for Life". We have forthcoming trips planned for the Brackley Antiques Centre, Gates's Garden Centre and Oakham and a theatre visit to "Barnum".

April and May bring to mind warmer days, good gardening weather, leaves decking the trees and a lightening mood as the flowering season gets into full swing, painting the natural world with a smile on its face. These days our countryside has far fewer wildlife flowers due to the disappearance of wildflower meadows and changes in agricultural techniques.



One of the major consequences of this as you may have seen in the media, is the decline in the number of bees to pollinate plants that provide our food. Increasingly, gardens are playing a significant role in providing the flowers that can help sustain our bees and of course the other pollinators. This is where we can all do our bit for the bees by planting some bee-friendly plants in your garden this spring. If you search for The Bumble Bee Conservation web site there is all the info about bee friendly plants to help you with what to plant. As gardens cover over one million acres in the UK, you can see if we all do our bit we can make a significant difference in helping our bees There are lots of different types of bee in the UK – around 250 species! There are 24 species of bumblebees, around 225 species of solitary bee and just a single honeybee species. Bumblebees look quite different from honeybees and solitary bees. Here on the Broughton Astley Naturespot website we have records going back to 2006 and since that time we have recorded 14 species of bees in our village and these are;

You can see this is a really pitiful number and that is why we would like you to take a closer look at your garden flower's and record your visiting bees so we can identify what bee species we have .

Some of our UK bees have already gone missing with Cullem's bumblebee (Bombus cullumanus), was last recorded in 1941 and The Short-haired

bumblebee (Bombus subterraneus), and was last recorded in 1988.

If we do not record what we have we shall not know what we have lost!

On a more positive note we have been delighted to see that there have been good sightings of Little Egrets around the village this year and after leaving us for a while. They seem to be back in numbers and that's very encouraging as we enter into their breeding season. Kingfishers too, have been seen around the village and one of their favourite site seems to be in the Brook by the church. It's a spectacular bird and always a joy to see even if it's just a glimpse of that iridescent blue as it darts by at full pelt. Another couple of sightings of the Brown Hare recently is encouraging after their total absence over the winter months. Often overlooked during spring as they lay in the autumn sown cereal crops looking for all the world like a clod of earth, and can lay motionless for very long periods. Now spring is here they become more active and can be more easily seen often running at full tilt or nonchalantly eating with their large ears fully extended to remain wary of any danger. Protect your vehicle. Don't give thieves an easy ride

- Leave it on show expect it to go! Always remove valuables from your vehicle
- Remove sat navs including the support cradle and cables. Wipe away any suction pad marks
- Don't leave tools in vans overnight
- Make sure that doors are locked, windows are closed and keys are removed when you leave the car, even if it's only for a moment
- On icy mornings, never leave your vehicle unattended with the engine running
- Park your vehicle in a well-lit area that is visible to others, or covered by CCTV
- If you have a garage, use it. Always lock your vehicle and garage
- Consider fitting a metal cage to your catalytic convertor or have it etched
- Register any vehicle equipment such as CD players, in-car DVD players, and sat navs for free with immobilise.com

Report fly-tipping in the Harborough district

If fly-tipping is on land that Harborough District Council manages they will investigate your report within 7 working days and clear the fly-tip within 14 working days - sometimes because of the contents of the fly-tip they may need to use specialist teams to clear the waste and this could take longer than usual.



If after investigation it is found that the fly-tip is on private land it will be the responsibility of the landowner to remove it.
