Purse bells

With funding provided by Harborough District Council we have distributed purse bells. These can be attached to your purse or handbag zip to deter pickpockets.

They are available for free to pick up from Age Concern, Age UK, and LOROS in Lutterworth.

The town does not currently have an issue with pick pocketing but the force is aware of organised groups who travel the country and want to make Lutterworth a difficult place for them to operate.

A dozen cannabis plants were discovered by Lutterworth officers in a property on Fairway Meadows, Ullesthorpe in early August.

Officers acted after the smell of cannabis became noticeable in the quiet residential area and the occupants were subsequently arrested on 'suspicion of cultivating cannabis'.

They have since been handed community resolution orders by police. The plants and equipment were seized and sent for destruction.

Ask for Angela

Going out? Planning a date? Make sure you also take some time to consider the venue. Various pubs and bars across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland are taking part in the "Ask for Angela" initiative to help you feel safer while out and about. Staff at participating venues have been trained to recognise the discrete safe word, 'Angela', alerting them to a problem. The member of staff can then offer to call a taxi for you, provide a safe place for you to contact a friend, or help you to leave the venue if you are feeling unsafe due to someone else's actions, words or behaviour.

So, if you don't feel safe, if your date isn't who they said they were, or if things just don't feel quite right, go to the bar and ask for Angela.
