Rural Crime:

We continue to see a decrease in rural crime across Leicestershire and Rutland as a whole, looking at the figures from a year to date basis, there is a current decline of 13.6%. This is positive news and we will continue to strive to drive down the numbers.

The team continues to manage crimes across the county, dealing with a number of various issues that have arisen, including; breaks to outbuilding, thefts, criminal damage, disturbing nesting birds, just to name a few.

It is pivotal that crime in rural areas continues to be reported. The reporting of rural crime allows officers to depict the data and find arising crime patterns and details. This can be done by reporting online via the Leicestershire Police website or via 101.

Engagements:

We have been doing what we can to keep the engagements high this summer across the county, this has seen the team visiting county shows, attending local events and working with our volunteers to be at as many places as we can.











We have had to manage this alongside supporting our colleagues with an increase in summer demand across all aspects of policing, including those that have been well publicised in the media recently.

Chris and Matt have also been volunteering with the Belvoir Cricket and Countryside Trust, working with primary school children from across Leicestershire and Lincolnshire, building trust with the police and engaging them in rural activities.



Rural Recoveries

£1.7 MILLION

The team has now amassed over £1.7m worth of recoveries since it was formed. Returning stolen items to their owners is something that we always endeavour to achieve, although not always possible, we like to share the good news stories.



The recovery of items is always easier when owners have taken due diligence to ensure their items are either; **trackable**, **identifiable or even better a combination of them both**.



Notifiable recoveries and incidents recently have involved telehandlers. An incident which occurred in South Leicestershire, whereby a Manitou telehandler was stolen this has led to the arrest and investigation to 5 males. This investigation is an ongoing investigation therefore specific details will not be published, however we will publish further details on the investigation when we can.

Please endeavour to secure your premises and items the best you can, ensuring that keys are removed from machines and stored in a safe place. Serial numbers for kit such as trailers, power-tools and agri vehicles. It is always worth reviewing your security on a regular basis, ensuring that CCTV is in working order, security lights are working and active, boundaries are secure, etc.

Positive Outcomes

- Person found to have disturbed roosting bats in Charnwood, issued with a conditional caution to pay £500 to a wildlife charity and supply timber for the building of bat boxes
- 5 males arrested in connection with the theft and handling of a stolen Manitou telehandler - Further information will be posted in relation to the investigation a later date
- Person found to have stolen soil in Rutland and given a community resolution after admitting the offence
- Person found to be illegally fishing and in possession of a lock knife, charged and set to appear at Leicester Magistrates Court.

August saw us introduce the latest 4x4 vehicle to our fleet. The new vehicle has been kindly funded by **Triumph Motorcycles** at Hinckley. This new vehicle has been kitted out with ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition), another tool in the kitbag for catching those responsible for committing crime.
